### **BACKGROUND**

Historically, the idea for the National Engineering Science and Technology Essay Competition, NESTEC was conceived after an untoward incident at 2018 International Conference on Exhibition Power and Telecommunication, ICEPT held in Port Harcourt, Rivers State where students who participated in the technical competition were poorly rewarded. To address the reward system and make the competition robust, it was necessary to take off the burden of organizing such an event from NIEEE and rather partner with it.

# Thus, NESTEC has the manifold objectives;

- 1. To unlock the untapped potentials among youths in the field of engineering science
- 2. Promote research and scholarship among engineering students
- 3. Encourage and develop capacity for technical paper and essay writing
- 4. Introduce the students into mainstream trending and advances in engineering science and technology
- 5. Create local and global opportunities for students and young graduate engineering personnel to showcase their talents.

### STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION

The competition is structure to allow for participation, engagement, and transparency in outcome. Participation is nationwide and is made to cover all the institutions of higher learning, both public and private universities, polytechnic and monotechnic.

The participants whose papers passed the screening and met the requirements are published on the blog. This enables interactivity between the authors and public. The assessors were also noting responses and could ask questions along with the public. Authors were advised to respond appropriately to questions asked by anyone. The assessors were not known to the authors and even among the assessors their identities were not known till the award day. This was to allow for independent assessment and transparency.

### **ASSESSMENT CRITERIA**

The assessment/grading criteria were based on the following;

1. Originality in idea – 20%

Means paper submitted has fresh, new insight, approach and solution to existing national problem and need

- 2. Paper meeting the need of the Nigerian society 20%

  Means solutions proffer have the capacity to solve the nation's problem and or meeting her needs
- 3. Clarity and neatness in presentation 20%

Means the presentation is clear both in typing and language. The organization is well structure and arrange in a format for easy understanding. Diagrams, charts, histograms, photos etc are used where necessary

4. Technical evaluation of work - 30%

Means technical and or engineering solution is offered

Public Interactivity: comments, questions and answers on Engineers' Forum blog –

Means the public is engaged with the subject matter and it elicits much interest and comments albeit positively. The author is active in responding to questions and showing clear understanding to his/her work.

### **MOVEMENT OF PAPER TO THE LIBRARY**

Papers were moved to the LIBRARY (<a href="https://engineersforum.com.ng/category/library/technical-papers/">https://engineersforum.com.ng/category/library/technical-papers/</a>) from the main page of the blog after 48 hours of visibility for continuous interaction. Assessors were provided forms to compute their scores and submit to the Technical Committee for final collation and grading on 7<sup>th</sup> of November 2019. All assessors worked independently.

While we acknowledge that the volume of work was light to deal only on field of specialty, it was expected that assessors can still interact with all authors irrespective of area of specialty. Each assessor was expected to ask each author a minimum of two questions on the paper.

Submission of score sheet was to <u>info@engineersforum.com.ng</u> on 7<sup>th</sup> of November 2019. However, final score sheet was submitted on the 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2019. The Technical Committee completed collation less than 24 hours to the event day.

Winners were declared on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2019 at Sheraton & Towers Hotel, Ikeja, Lagos.

### **PAPERS SUBMITTED**

A total of 150 abstracts were received and 139 papers were submitted. Only 13 papers were published thus automatically qualifying authors to the final. This implies that 126 papers were screened out for not meeting the required standards. It was noticed that most students did not read the published INSTRUCTION. This led to many of the disqualification.

Our projections were to received 500 papers and accept 50% for publishing. This would have required engaging more assessors. The low participation could be attributed to being its maiden edition and low publicity.

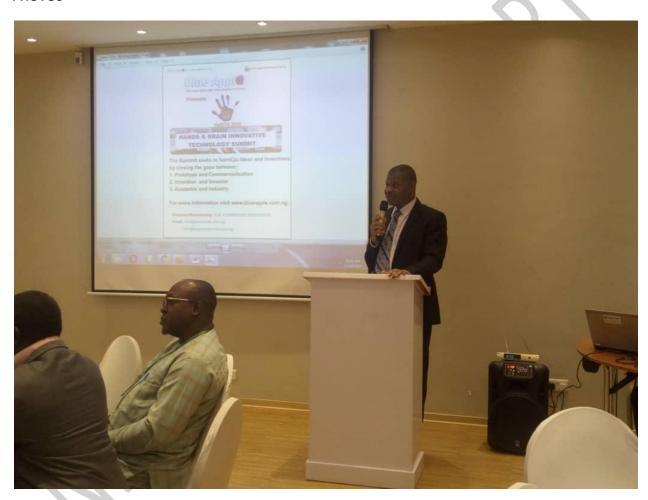
